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Letter from Aharon Botzer

CEO & Founder, Livnot U'Lehibanot

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Shalom Chevre,

In 1980, Livnot was founded because something essential was missing from the Israel experience for young adults: **Jewish depth**.

From the beginning, Livnot integrated hands-on community service with learning Jewish values through hiking the Land of Israel, alongside a spiritual Shabbat in Tzfat.

We were built for seekers: travelers, students, and young professionals searching for purpose, identity, and belonging in the Holy Land of Israel.

Over decades, Livnot has touched the lives of thousands of young adults ages 21–35, almost all arriving with limited Jewish background or connection. The impact is unmistakable.

When participants come back to visit us in Tzfat with their family, they often tell their children: “my time at Livnot is why you are who you are.”

Post-program evaluations show that over 90% of participants describe Livnot as a transformative experience. Alumni feedback collected 10–45 years after participation—representing thousands of respondents—consistently identifies Livnot as a pivotal point in their lives.

Many now serve as leaders in the Jewish professional world as educators, Federation staff, and clergy of all denominations.

Since October 7th, Livnot has once again answered the national call. As we have done for 45 years, we moved immediately, leading rebuilding efforts on the ground while providing rich educational content. We are not new to crisis response and a trusted partner of the IDF and dozens of communities in Israel.

Still today, tens of thousands of young people come to Israel each year. They encounter Zionism. They partake in volunteerism. However, they rarely get a taste of spirituality beyond a visit to The Kotel.

Livnot stands apart. We insist that building Israel and strengthening Jewish identity must happen together. I invite you to visit and partner with us in this next chapter—to rebuild Israel while shaping the next generation of deeply connected Jewish leaders.



Rebuilding Programs (8 days)

Hands-on rebuilding in war-impacted communities. Participants work alongside professional teams to address real needs, while spending afternoons engaged in touring the North and Jewish learning.

Holiday Programs (8 Days)

Integrating Jewish learning, hiking, communal living, and volunteering.

One-Day Volunteering

Service-learning for Birthright, corporate, and organized groups. Combines hands-on rebuilding with facilitated educational sessions.

Shabbat Experiences (3 Days)

An immersive introduction to Shabbat through hiking, shared meals, learning, music, reflection, and community.




The Experience:

Visitors journey seven levels beneath the Old City, walking seven levels underground through tunnels accompanied by an artistic sound-and-light experience that brings four Kabbalists of Tzfat to life. The tunnels lead into The Beit HaKahal, a restored 16th-century community center and marketplace.

The Impact:

The Visitors Center welcomes tens of thousands of visitors annually and serves as a core educational component of Livnot programs and local tourism.



Beit Hakahal

Beit Hakahal is a 16th-century marketplace excavated by Livnot volunteers and designated an **Israeli National Heritage Site** by the Ministry of Antiquities since 2011. The site welcomes tens of thousands of visitors annually for educational workshops and seasonal activities, and features a 500-year-old stone oven and a heated, historic mikvah.

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Why Tzfat?

- One of Judaism's four holy cities and the birthplace of Jewish mysticism, Tzfat offers a natural setting for spiritual depth and inner exploration.
- A city that has drawn seekers, artists, and thinkers for centuries, creating an atmosphere where Jewish learning and creativity feel alive and ongoing.
- Spirituality is part of everyday life through ancient synagogues, the shared rhythm of Shabbat, historic stone streets, and the surrounding Galilee landscape.
- Tzfat allows the space for deep relationships, meaningful service, and the kind of personal growth that stays with participants long after they leave.





A Legacy of Building & Being Built

Over Four Decades of Heritage, Education, and Community Service

- **1980 | Official Recognition**

The program receives prompt approval from the Department of Aliyah (Kibbutz Ulpan office).

- **1980 | Inception**

Livnot is born, launching its inaugural program with 13 participants to combine physical building with spiritual exploration.

The start of 3-6 three-month programs annually for the next 20 years.

- **1982 | Forged in Crisis**

After the First Lebanon War, Livnot participants filled sandbags in bunkers on the Syrian Border, establishing an ethos of immediate crisis response.

- **1982 | Operation Moses**

Livnot played a critical role in the historic Ethiopian Aliyah, helping new immigrants acclimate to Israel.

- **1990-1991 | Anchoring Roots**

Strategic purchase of the Tzfat Campus and the Kahal property to establish a permanent home.

- **1991 | Immigrant Vocational Training**

Launched B'Aaretz U'B'aam, a specialized program training Russian builders.

- **1992 | Federation Partnerships**

Commenced a longstanding partnership with UJA Federation NY. Simultaneously, West Palm Beach Federation selected Tzfat as a Sister City largely due to Livnot's impact.

- **1995-2004 | Leadership Development**

Hosted the OTZMA leadership training program, shaping future Jewish leaders for the Jewish Federations of North America (JFNA).

- **1997 | Excellence in Service:**

Expanded the community service model across five cities; (Hatzor, Hadera, Jerusalem, Beit Shemesh, Tzfat) and was awarded Best Volunteer Organization in Jerusalem.

- **1998 | The Blueprint for Birthright:**
Philanthropist Michael Steinhardt visited the campus, declaring Livnot's model "the inspiration for Birthright". This influence is documented in Steinhardt's book, "Jewish Pride."

- **1999-2008 | Birthright Launch:**
As Birthright Israel launched, Livnot was selected as one of the first providers. Livnot operated distinct 14-day Birthright programs emphasizing learning and hiking, and two Shabbatot after a full week.

- **2000-2001 | Elite Alliance:**
Recognized as one of six elite educational programs (Alliance Programs) alongside Pardes and WUJS.

- **2002-2004 | Shabbat Programs for IDF**
Launched Shabbat programming for IDF and opened the Tzfat Information Visitors Center.

- **2005 | Partnership with MASA**
Launched the first five-month MASA program. An Alliance study rated Livnot top-tier in follow-up, relationship with staff and Israel connection and received the prestigious Yakir Tzfat Prize.

- **2006 | Crisis Leadership (Second Lebanon War):**
When the local municipality staff of Tzfat evacuated, Livnot provided for the elderly who needed around the clock assistance after their caretakers were notified by their embassies to leave the North.

After the war and over the course of a year, a staff of 25 builders and volunteers on two week programs restored over 100 bomb shelters in Tzfat/Hatzor—supported by West Palm Beach Federation—and 120 Bomb Shelters in Kiryat Shmona, supported by New York Federation.

- **2011 | National Heritage Site:**
The Beit HaKahal was officially declared a National Heritage Site by the Israeli Government.
- **2012-2013 | Tzfat Restoration:**
Participants built infrastructure at the Citadel (Metzudah). Renovated 17 apartments for vulnerable populations in Tzfat with the JDC.
- **2013 | Shabbat Book**
After an article about Shabbat by Michael Steinhardt came out, 300 Livnot participants wrote to him about their unique experience.
- **2014 | Strategic Collaboration:**
Facilitated a collaboration between the Jewish Agency and Shapira Foundation to create Onward Israel.

- **2016-2017 | Birthright Plus:**
Successfully integrated into the Birthright Plus extension with Maimonides support.
- **2020 | Digital Pivot:**
During the Corona crisis, Livnot engaged thousands of alumni globally via 70 Zoom programs.
- **2023-2026 | Swords of Iron Response:**
At the request of the Army, Livnot mobilized immediately to begin critical work in the Gaza Envelope and Lebanese Border in over 400 support war relief projects with 25 professional builders and hundreds of volunteers on a regular basis.

A Call for Unity

For the Rabbis signed here, from all denominations, Livnot was the pivotal point in their journey towards serving their communities as rabbis. They have come together in agreement to add their voice to the following statement:

We, the Jewish People, are a small nation with great gifts, endless potential and a lofty destiny. Our goal as a people, defined by the prophets, is to actualize the talents and skills and wisdom of each and every one of us for the benefit of all humanity. Despite this well-defined vision, the Jewish people of our generation faces accelerating fragmentation and mutual alienation between religious groups and denominations leading to a divisiveness that threatens achieving our national destiny as a light unto the nations.

Consequently, we believe it to be incumbent upon all responsible Jewish leaders to work together to bridge and heal these rifts, to help all Jews of all persuasions feel connected to each other and to their heritage in personal, meaningful and effective ways. We call on all who can help in this mission to seek ways to engage with our tradition and to reach out to all Jews in the spirit of inclusiveness and the understanding that we are all responsible for one another.
